## 1 Introduction

`echo(1)` is a Unix command line tool, which writes its command line arguments to the standard output. This is a simple acceptance test suite for the `echo` implementation.

## 2 No arguments

Run `echo` without arguments.

*when* user runs `echo` without arguments

*then* exit code is **0**

*and* standard output contains a newline

*and* standard error is empty

## 3 Hello, world

This scenario runs `echo` to produce the output “hello, world”.

*when* user runs echo with arguments **hello, world**  
*then* exit code is **0**  
*and* standard output contains "**hello, world**"  
*and* standard error is empty
